




Number of Schools and Students







Number of Teachers and Classes




Number of Students per Teacher

Desirable character; organizing principle; education goals, educational organization, time allocation, focus of operation by school grade; curriculum operation and evaluation (common for all schools); support for school curriculum

Textbook Policy Orientation

Greater freedom for textbook appearance

- Defined paper quality (76mg), but free choice of size and pages

- Textbooks for primary school will be developed by theme.
- Free pricing and more superintendent-recognized textbooks
- Pricing will be decided by publishers.
- Over-pricing can be ordered to be adjusted.

Textbook selection authority to be given to principals

- Individual schools will form a selection committee.
- School Operation Committee will review textbooks.




